You are eligible to apply for the Wisconsin Homestead Tax Credit if: you are at least 18 years old, a Wisconsin resident <u>all</u> of 2022, your total household income was less than \$24,680, and you paid property taxes or rent in 2022.

If you are under age 62 and disabled, documentation must be provided to verify disability status, such as: *a physicians document verifying the date the disability started, *a statement from the Veterans Administration certifying the total and permanent disability, *a Social Security document stating the date the disability began.

****** You must bring with you: *****

- 2022 property tax bill (<u>a copy to mail with your credit request</u>) or a 2022 landlord completed rent certificate.
- Verification of <u>ALL</u> 2022 income, (1099 forms) including interest, dividends, wages, SSI and Social Security.
- Verification of 2022 health insurance premiums paid if you claim interest income.

Site dates will be cancelled and rescheduled if weather conditions <u>delay</u> or <u>close</u> schools in your area! No appointments/reservations are necessary for the <u>above mentioned clinics</u>.

Medicare Advantage Plan Open Enrollment Period Ends March 31, 2023

Just a reminder that the Medicare Advantage Plan open enrollment ends March 31, 2023! *This only applies to those who already have a Medicare Advantage plan.*

During this time, you can:

- Switch to another Medicare Advantage Plan (with or without drug coverage) if you're already a Medicare Advantage Plan (with or without drug coverage).
- Disenroll from your Medicare Advantage Plan and return to Original Medicare. If you choose to do so, you'll be able to join a Medicare drug plan.
- If you enrolled in a Medicare Advantage Plan during your Initial Enrollment Period (IEP), you can change to another Medicare Advantage Plan (with or without a Medicare drug plan) within the first three months you have Medicare.

You can only make one change during this period. Changes will take effect the first of the month after the plan gets your request.

You can't:

- Switch from Original Medicare to a Medicare Advantage Plan.
- Join a Medicare drug plan if you're in Original Medicare.
- Switch from one Medicare Prescription Drug Plan to another if you're in Original Medicare.

Spring General Elections

(by Lori Miller, League of Women Voters - Greater Chippewa Valley)

On April 4, 2023, Wisconsin voters will go to the polls for the spring general election. Depending on where you live, your ballot could include candidates for municipal or county offices, school board positions, or resolutions. However, candidates for one state-level position – a Wisconsin Supreme Court justice – and two amendments (one constitutional and one advisory) will appear on every ballot across the state.

Make sure you are registered to vote in Wisconsin, either by contacting your municipal clerk or by checking on MyVote.wi.gov or by mail (through March 15) or in-person at your municipal clerk's office (through March 31). You must provide a proof of residence. You can also register at the polls on election day; in that case, be sure to bring a proof of residence and a proof of identification.

Other deadlines for the April 4 election:

Requesting an absentee ballot by mail, online, email, fax: Now through March 31st. However, the League of Women Voters-Greater Chippewa Valley (LWV-GCV) recommends making your request as early as possible and no later than March 21st. You must submit a photo ID, if one is not already on file at your municipal clerk's office. Your municipal clerk will mail absentee ballots starting on March 14th to voters who have valid requests on file.

Voting your absentee ballot: In-person at your municipal clerk's office between March 21st-March 31st; contact your municipal clerk to verify times and dates. Mail: Return your completed ballot as soon as possible, so that your municipal clerk receives your ballot by 8:00pm on April 4, 2023. Or return your ballot in-person at the polls on election day.

<u>Sample ballots</u>: Start checking <u>MyVote.wi.gov</u> on March 14 to see your sample ballot. In Wisconsin, sample ballots are posted three weeks before an election that includes only state and local offices and seven weeks before elections that include federal offices.

LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

Let me start off by introducing myself - my name is Matthew Bertelson and I am the Nutrition Program Coordinator for Buffalo & Pepin Counties. I have deep roots in Durand and the surrounding areas and am passionate about this work as a way to give back to my community.

The Nutrition Program (more commonly known as Meals on Wheels) is a part of the Aging and Disability Resource Center and provides nutrition services to qualifying adults aged 60 and up, as well as their spouse or domestic partner. The nutrition program's mission is to help seniors live independently by promoting better health through improved nutrition and reduced isolation. Services include not only meals but nutrition screening, nutrition education, and counseling. A common misconception is that the nutrition program only provides home delivered meals, when in fact we currently have four locations throughout Buffalo and Pepin Counties that provide the opportunity for in-person dining. These senior dining centers give older adults a place to enjoy a fresh, healthy meal with others while encouraging a sense of community and friendship. I have seen firsthand the power of conversation and laughter that gets shared throughout these dining centers.

None of this is possible without the dedication and generosity of volunteers and the meal sites who prepare the food. The drivers deliver much more than just a meal; they are a helping hand, a conversation, a way to combat isolation. With that being said, we are in need of more volunteer drivers for both Buffalo and Pepin Counties.

Volunteer drivers are able to receive mileage reimbursement at a current rate of \$0.583 per mile. If you have a clean driving record and want to fill your free time with something rewarding while giving back to your community, please consider volunteering with our program.
