MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT IS HERE!

The annual Open Enrollment Period for Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage Plans is from October 15th through December 7th. During this time, Medicare beneficiaries can re-examine their current Medicare Part D drug plan coverage and/or Medicare Advantage Plan coverage.

Beneficiaries already enrolled in one of these plans will receive an Annual Notice of Change in the mail from the plan. This notice should have been mailed to you during the month of September, and should be reviewed for any changes to plan deductibles, co-pays, and drug coverage.



Since these plans renew an annual contract with Medicare, it is recommended that all Medicare beneficiaries review which plan may best suit your needs for the following year.

The Medicare website, <u>www.medicare.gov</u> has a very helpful plan finder tool to use for this purpose.

Unfortunately, research shows that fewer than 10% of Medicare beneficiaries are enrolled in the most cost-effective Part D plan. Just because your neighbor or a friend has a certain plan, or one plan's premium is lower than another plan, these are not good ways to choose a plan.

There are several ways to get help choosing a Medicare Part D or Medicare Advantage Plan:





WHEAP Energy Assistance Benefits

The Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) provides assistance for heating costs, electric costs, and energy crisis situations. Operating with federal and state funding, the program provides assistance to households across our service area to help lower the burden of monthly energy costs.

WHEAP assistance is a one-time payment during the heating season (October 1-May 15). The funding pays a portion of energy costs, and the payment is not intended to cover the entire annual energy costs of a residence. The amount of the energy assistance payment varies depending on a variety of factors, including the household's size, income, and energy costs.

To qualify for Energy Assistance for the 2023-2024 heating season, you must meet these eligibility guidelines.



Type <u>www.medicare.gov</u> into your web address bar and the Medicare homepage will open as follows (see below)



Click on Log in/Create Account.

Since I am a caregiver for my husband, my friend mentioned I should sign up for the Purple Tube Project. What is the Purple Tube Project and how do I know if it's right for me? Sincerely, Wondering Wanda

Dear Wondering Wanda,

It sounds like you and your husband would be great candidates for the Purple Tube Project! Let me tell you a bit more about the Purple Tube Project (PTP). It is an emergency preparedness tool for people with dementia and their loved ones. PTP uses information about an individual to intervene during a crisis and fills gaps in first responder's knowledge. It's a very simple process. Important documents are put in a purple tube, provided at no cost. In an emergency, dispatch will notify first responders there is a person with dementia in the home and there is a Purple Tube that has important documents. The tube is placed in the refrigerator where the first responders are trained to look. Small purple stickers are also placed on the inside of each entry door to confirm. Participating clients sign a confidentiality agreement allowing dispatch to enter their information into their system. Any information provided is 100% confidential and limited to dispatch in emergency situations only.
