# When Is the Open Enrollment Period? Are you ready? OCT NOV DEC JAN October 15th through Coverage

December 7th



The Medicare annual open enrollment period is just around the corner and now is a good time to start thinking about your options. Do you have a Medicare Prescription Drug (Part D) plan or a Medicare Advantage plan? The plans' premiums, deductibles, and co-pays can change each year. That means even if your healthcare needs or medications haven't changed, the amount you pay for your premiums may change in 2025!

What can people do about this? Anyone with a Medicare Part D Plan or Medicare Advantage plan should check their coverage each year during Medicare's annual open enrollment period which runs October 15th through December 7th. This is the time of year to find out if your current plan will cost you more, or less than other plans in 2025. If it is no longer the best plan for your health care needs or medications, this is the time to make a switch to a Part D or Advantage plan that will suit you better.

#### Asking for a Loved One Who Has Passed Away...

A person with dementia (PWD) may repeatedly ask for a relative or friend who has passed away, not remembering that they have passed. Reminding a PWD of their loved one's passing can cause great distress and grief, as if they're learning about the death for the first time all over again. It can also cause strong feelings of denial or anger. If you are caregiving for a PWD who frequently asks for a loved one who has passed away, start by considering why the PWD might be searching for their loved one. Is a man asking for his wife because he's hungry and seeking an afternoon snack as his wife always prepared for him? Is a woman asking for her husband because she's looking to read the morning newspaper which her husband always brought indoors for her? There's commonly a reason why a PWD is asking or searching for someone. As a caregiver, understanding this and knowing how to respond in these situations can be most helpful. Consider trying the following approaches.

- Validate the PWD's search for their loved one but rather than remind them of their loved one's passing, ask if there is a way you can help. You might say: "Dad, I know that you're looking for Mom. Is there something that I can help you with right now?" This approach may help determine an unmet need as described above.
- Without reminding the PWD of their loved one's passing, encourage the PWD to share conversation about their loved one. You might say: "Dad, I know that you're looking for Mom. Say, how long have you and Mom been married? How did you meet? What do you love most about Mom?" This approach allows the PWD to enjoy memories of their loved one, without being reminded of their passing.
- Without reminding the PWD of their loved one's passing, encourage the PWD to enjoy photos and other memorabilia of their loved one. You might say: "Dad, I know that you're looking for Mom. She's not here right now but we have photos of her in our photo album. Let's take a look at the photos for the time being. You can tell me about Mom."
- If it seems best to remove the PWD's attention away from their deceased loved one, consider bringing up another topic or activity. You might say: "Dad, I know you're looking for Mom. I could really use your help though. Would you mind helping me fold this laundry?" You may substitute laundry for any safe task or activity that the PWD would enjoy. This may include another household task, preparing a snack, or taking a walk.

#### Are You Ready? Medicare's Open Enrollment Period is Right Around the Corner

It is almost that time of year again, when the airwaves are full of Medicare commercials touting that the insurance coverage you have right now isn't good enough, and that you're missing out on all sorts of benefits that you are entitled to. You're probably familiar with these advertisements: they often feature a celebrity, a wellknown figure that you can "trust." The commercials are a reminder that Medicare's Open Enrollment Period, which is October 15 – December 7, 2024, is right around the corner. This is the time of year that Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year - things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. The October 15 – December 7 period is also when people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs. Television commercials will try to entice you with additional benefits or make you feel like you are missing out. These ads can be confusing and can use potentially misleading marketing tactics. Mailings will have messages of urgency, telling you that you need to respond within 5-7 business days to make sure all benefits are available to you.

BE CAREFUL! If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Decisions don't need to be made quickly. You have until December 7, 2024, to make changes to your Medicare coverage that will take effect on January 1, 2025. Before you change plans, or sign up for Medicare when you're eligible, it's important to do some factfinding to make sure that you understand what benefits and plans are available to you where you live. You want to have accurate and necessary information to make coverage choices that best meet your needs. Here are a few important things to know before you make the decision to call the number on the TV screen or respond to a flyer you received in the mail:

- While the commercials and mailings use the word Medicare, and perhaps the red, white, and blue colors and images of a Medicare card, the telephone numbers that are displayed on these commercials are NOT Medicare, but rather a licensed insurance agent or broker. The fine print on the bottom of the TV screen or mailing, which is almost impossible to read, states that these plans are not affiliated with any government program or agency.
- The benefits that are mentioned (eyeglasses, hearing aids, rides to appointments, etc.) are benefits that MAY be offered with certain Medicare Advantage plans. Medicare Advantage plans vary greatly from state to state, and even county to county, so it is important to do your homework. In some cases, there are additional costs associated with these benefits or eligibility guidelines that must be met to qualify. It is not a "one size fits all" type of option. What's the bottom line? By responding to the TV commercials or mailers, you may end up with a Medicare Advantage plan that is not available in your area, does not include your preferred health care provider, or has costs that you were not anticipating. And since the new plan doesn't go into effect until January 1, 2025, you may not find out these things until it's too late. So, what can you do to make sure that you understand all your options?
- Do your homework and become an informed consumer. Make sure that you understand the differences between Medicare Part A, B, C, and D and other plans available such as Medigap. Yes, it can be complicated, but there are available resources across the state of Wisconsin that provide unbiased information, at no cost to you. #### **WHEAP Energy Assistance Benefits**

The Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) helps with heating costs, electric costs, and energy crisis situations. Operating with federal and state funding, the program helps households across our service area to help lower the burden of monthly energy costs. WHEAP assistance is a one-time payment during the heating season (October 1-May 15). The funding pays a portion



home energy

of energy costs, and the payment is not intended to cover the entire annual energy costs of a residence. The amount of the energy assistance payment varies depending on a variety of factors, including the household's size, income, and energy costs. To qualify for Energy Assistance for the 2024-2025 heating season, you must meet these eligibility guidelines.


